## Status of heavy flooded households in Kampong Khleang Commune,

### Sotr Nikom District, Siem Reap Province

Kampong Khleang is one of the communes located in Sotr Nikom district a distance of 50kms to the southeast of Siem Reap town. This commune consists of 10 villages which covers the fishery community areas along the Tonle Sap Great Lake. Most of the household heads are fishermen and fishing is their main occupation. The 10 villages that were most impacted by the heavy floods in this commune and desperately need rice are as follows:

1. Mouk Wat village: 20 families (poor ID level 1), 12 families (poor ID Level 2) total: 32 families
2. Spean Veng village: 26 families (poor ID level 1), 8 families (poor ID Level 2) total: 34 families
3. Prek Sramouch village: 34 families (poor ID level 1), 38 families (poor ID Level 2) total: 72 families
4. Tauo Sar village: 10 families (poor ID level 1), 19 families (poor ID Level 2) total: 29 families
5. Phsar Khleang village: 16 families (poor ID level 1), 24 families (poor ID Level 2) total: 40 families
6. Chey Chet village: 19 families (poor ID level 1), 8 families (poor ID Level 2) total: 27 families
7. Cham Karyuon village: 12 families (poor ID level 1), 43 families (poor ID Level 2) total: 55 families
8. O Tatput village: 34 families (poor ID level 1), 34 families (poor ID Level 2) total: 68 families
9. Ro Teang village: 23 families (poor ID level 1), 27 families (poor ID Level 2) total: 50 families
10. Ta Chraneang village: 37 families (poor ID level 1), 62 families (poor ID Level 2) total: 99 families

Totally, the population of the 10 villages is amounted to 506 families.

The Kampong Khleang commune villagers regularly get flooded half the year and are dry half the year. Currently, due to the heavy floods caused by the heavy rains, the Mekong, as well as the swelling Tonle Sap Great Lake caused massive damage to their houses leaving them no place to live except at the pagoda as the water went up to the roof of their house. These families are in great need of rice to survive.

**One 50kg bag of rice costs \$28USD and will feed one family for one month. It will cost \$15,000USD to provide each of the 506 families with one 50kg bag of rice.**

Note: The above figure of 506 families only focuses on the families who were most impacted by the heavy floods, not the total number of families in the whole commune.
